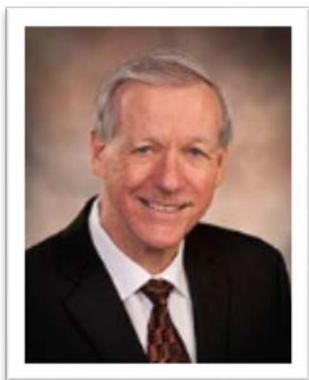


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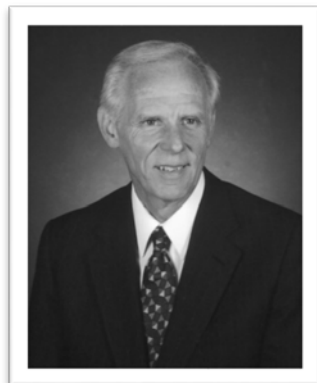

Dr. Jerry D. Porter

Dr. Jerry D. Porter is a general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene with an office at the Global Ministry Center of the denomination in Lenexa, Kansas.



He was chosen for this highest elected office in the church at the 24th General Assembly at San Antonio, Texas, in June 1997 while serving as the district superintendent for the Washington (DC) District of the Church of the Nazarene.

Dr. Porter was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, the son of Dr. and Mrs. William Porter. He married the former Toni Dubs from York, Pennsylvania. The Porters were blessed with two children, Amy Jo and William Britt. At age 17 Amy's left arm had to be amputated due to synovial cell sarcoma cancer in her wrist. She battled courageously for the next four years and passed away December 2, 1995.

Jerry and Toni graduated from Bethany Nazarene College (now SNU) in 1971 with bachelor of arts degrees in religion and Spanish, respectively. In the summer of 1972, Jerry received a master of arts in theology degree. He also did graduate studies at Nazarene Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri. In 1988 Southern Nazarene University conferred the honorary doctor of divinity degree.

He was ordained an elder in the Church of the Nazarene on the Houston District by General Superintendent Charles Strickland in 1974 while pastoring the Angleton, Texas, Church of the Nazarene, on the Houston District.

Following a 2½-year pastoral tenure, Jerry and Toni were appointed missionaries to the Dominican Republic to help launch the work of the Church of the Nazarene in that island republic. The assignment included church planting and directing the theological education by extension program. Following rapid and explosive growth of the church in the Dominican Republic, the Porters were assigned to San Jose, Costa Rica, where he served as rector of the Nazarene Seminary of the Americas.

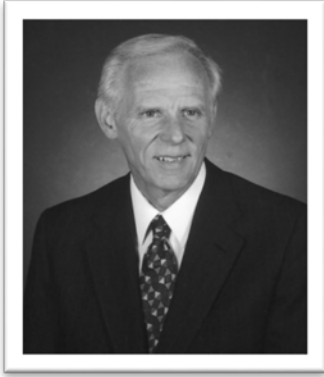
During the next seven years the seminary grew to an enrollment of over 100 students on campus with nearly 3,000 in extension centers throughout Latin America.

In 1986 Dr. Porter was elected by the General Board of the Church of the Nazarene to serve as the regional director for the Mexico/Central America Region. This region encompasses eight nations from Mexico to Panama and, at that time, represented 22 districts with over 50 missionaries and six theological institutions.

During Amy's treatment in Dallas in early 1992, Jerry was elected to serve as the third district superintendent on the Mid-Atlantic District (formerly Washington District) which encompasses Maryland, Delaware, south central Pennsylvania, Washington D. C., and eastern West Virginia. In addition to his responsibilities as district superintendent, Dr. Porter also served as chairman of the board of the Washington Nazarene Bible College Extension, a member of the Board of Trustees of Eastern Nazarene College and of Nazarene Theological Seminary, and a member of the Hiram F. Reynolds Research Institute at the International Center.

Dr. Porter has written various publications in Nazarene journals and is known primarily as a missionary evangelist. His wife has taught Christian education and women's ministry classes at the seminary in Costa Rica as well as served on the region and on the Mid-Atlantic District as women's ministries coordinator. She also organized and directed the scholarship program for ministers' children on the Mexico/Central America Region. She has a master's degree in theology, is a frequent speaker at women's retreats and seminars, and serves as a Nazarene Compassionate Ministry Child Sponsorship Spokesperson. The Porters live in Texas. Their son, Bill, and his wife, Kristen, and their grandsons, Ben and Nate, also live in Fort Worth, Texas. Bill serves in a rehabilitation program for troubled youth and recently completed his masters in counseling.


Dr. James R. Spruce



Jim Spruce has been superintendent of the Illinois District since September 2003, following seven years of service as the Nebraska District Superintendent. Pastorates have been at Flint (Central), Michigan; Centralia, Washington; Houston, Texas; Champaign and Belleville, Illinois; and Cadillac, Michigan. He was ordained in 1970.

Dr. Spruce has served as a member of the General Curriculum Committee and General NYI Council, Board of Pensions and Benefits and General Board. He is currently a member of the USA Course of Study Advisory Council and another general church committee. The author of five books, numerous articles and adult Sunday School lessons, he is a graduate of Bethany Nazarene College (now Southern Nazarene University), (B.A.), Nazarene Theological Seminary (M.Div.) and McCormick Theological Seminary (D.Min.).

Born in Blytheville, Arkansas in 1942 and reared in Nazarene parsonages, Jim married Karen Aller of Nampa, Idaho in 1963. Karen received a degree in music education at BNC. The Spruces have two daughters who live in Idaho, Cynthia Grinder and Sharolyn Schofield, and a son, Steve, of Auburn. Jim and Karen have seven grandchildren.



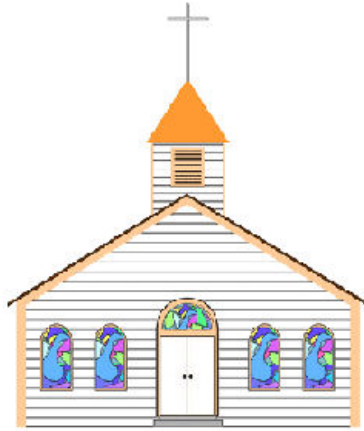

- Sirvo al Señor con todo mi corazón en este hermoso ministerio de música y demás ministerios de la Iglesia.

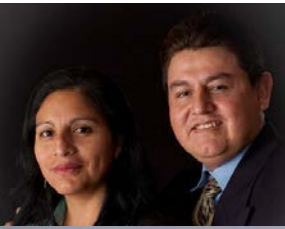
E. Ministerio de Eventos Sociales

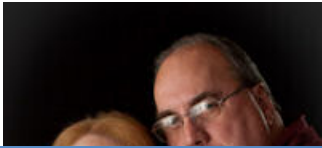

It is an honor to bring to you my third report as pastor of Bethel Community Church of the Nazarene. It is our mission to make known the good news of the saving power of Jesus Christ. To bear Spirit-empowered witness to the events of Christ's life, death, resurrection, and calling of all people to repentance for the forgiveness of sins. We have given ourselves faithfully to this mission.

I think of 45 kids, most from unsaved homes, singing praises to God, bowing in prayer at an altar, being fed the Word of God and fed physically. I think of the privilege of giving many of them their first Bible, and hearing reports of them carrying that Bible to school and reading it at "seat time." And hearing reports of their singing praise songs learned on Wednesday night at recess and in the hallway at school. When I think of this mission as a reality among us, I think of four souls who by profession of faith called upon the name of the Lord Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday morning. I think of several who stepped forward in our revival with Rev. Doug Haynes to consecrate themselves wholly to God.

When I think of this mission as a reality among us, I'm overjoyed to report the fact that 23% of all moneys raised was given to others - WEF, Christian Love In Action, Cass County Food Pantry, child sponsorship, local benevolence to the needy, Pregnancy Resource Center, all other budgets, etc. We are discovering that God blesses us to bless others.

When I think of this mission as a reality among us, I am reminded of and indebted to the Christ of the Mission. I am honored to know, love and serve the King of Kings! I am reminded of and indebted to the loving people of Bethel Community Church of the Nazarene who have continued for over 100 years to carry out the mission of Christ - to be fishers of men. This past year, we have had our ups and downs here at New Beginnings. We have seen two of our men who meant a lot too many in this congregation go on to be with the Lord. John Cox and Lee Thornburg will be missed and cannot be replaced. Many of our families in the church have also experienced personal problems. These issues have caused great pain; whether those issues dealt with family break ups, physical health, financial or emotional problems; they have all been serious for those that experienced them.

However, the thing that I have noticed throughout all these issues: death or otherwise, is that we as a church family have actually been the body of Christ to each other. We have been there to hold each other up and I think this has become one of our greatest assets. Through Jesus we have become a family that cares and loves for one another.

This is not to say that we have not had some good and wonderful things happen too. We had a fabulous Vacation Bible School with a lot of new faces and a wonderful spirit. We celebrated our 10 year anniversary at Evergreen Park with a great service and a great baptism service. We saw our children and adults perform a Christmas program that was absolutely wonderful. We had a visit from ONU Preaching Ambassador Josh Parker who brought a dynamic and Spirit filled message. Least of all, I have sensed that the Lord has used me this past year and that the messages that the Lord has given me have reached into the hearts of our congregation and that people have made incredible Spiritual break through this year.

Also, we have all of our bills paid through the end of the year and we still have money in the bank. Not a lot of money, but some; and there have been years in the past where we had nothing left in the bank to start the new church year with.

We have seen a slight increase in our Sunday School average for the year, with a 35 per Sunday average. We have seen an increase in our Wednesday evening to 32; and our Sunday morning worship average has stayed exactly the same 44. I believe that the Lord is sending us back to the street in 2014-2015 to be the hand and feet of Christ.

In April our leadership team began a process of Re-visioning for the future. Using the Church Health Assessment tool (thanks to the resources of our district), we have begun to identify areas of strength and weakness, and have begun building a strategic plan for the immediate future. Significant shifts are underway toward increasing the role of prayer, leadership development, and how we intentionally make disciples.

Transformation stories abound: Peggy, a county jail officer, along with her daughter, McKenzie, started attending our church last fall. After several months of experiencing God's love through our congregation, Peggy came to Christ. Her family has been enfolded into a small group and Peggy has become active in ministry. On Easter Sunday Peggy and McKenzie both testified before our congregation to their faith in Christ and were baptized together with three others.

Through the prayerful and financial partnership with many Illinois district local churches we are seeing God doing an amazing evangelistic work among the vast hispanic community surrounding the Collinsville area. Under Pastor David Samayoa's leadership we celebrated the official launch service of the Iglesia del Nazareno El Bueno Samaritano in February with a combined (english- and spanish-speaking congregations) worship service. Having our **Arcola Spanish** and **Beardstown Liberty Hispanic** congregations present with us on this day made it even that more memorable. This ministry continues to flourish and grow with many new faces being enfolded into our fellowship.

Our congregation highly values partnership with other community churches and ministries to express the love of Christ to our community. (1) Every Tuesday evening our churches come together to provide a healthy meal for the hungry and lonely in our community. (2) During the school year Good Sam Church oversees the tutoring program for students in the middle school. This has opened many doors for more personal ministry to both students and faculty. (3) Working with several community agencies this summer we began providing a daily lunch for the children of our school district who will not be receiving the free meals they were so dependent upon during the school year.

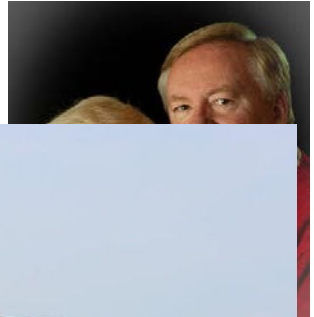

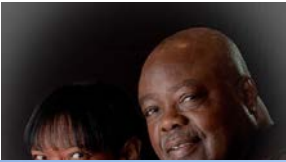

Laughter fills the air. Those sitting around the fire occasionally look at maps. A few tell stories of searches they have been part of in the past. Occasionally, the search coordinator walks to the edge of the woods and calls out, “Amanda, Amanda” in the hope that the little girl will hear and wander into the safety of the camp.

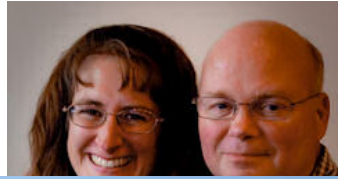
In many ways this is how we have been doing evangelism in Flora: we sing, preach, enjoy one another’s fellowship, all along hoping that the lost will hear about us and find their way into our church. Not a very effective plan!

As the Flora church we continue to revise our ministry, this year focusing on becoming more intentional about ministering to people outside our walls through acts of service. This past January our new nine member “*Outside the Walls Leadership Team*” met for the first time. To date the team has led the congregation in sponsoring “*Share the Harvest*”, a free rummage sale to the community that blessed about two hundred people, and “*Loads of Love*”, paying for the cost of washing laundry at two local Laundromats. Flora Nazarenes also provided refreshments, played with children, and even helped fold laundry. When asked why we were doing these things, we simply responded, “*We just wanted to show you God’s love in a practical way.*” A free car wash and a movie night in the park are being planned for the summer.

With God’s help we hope to change the way we view ministry: from almost completely within the church walls to largely outside our doors.

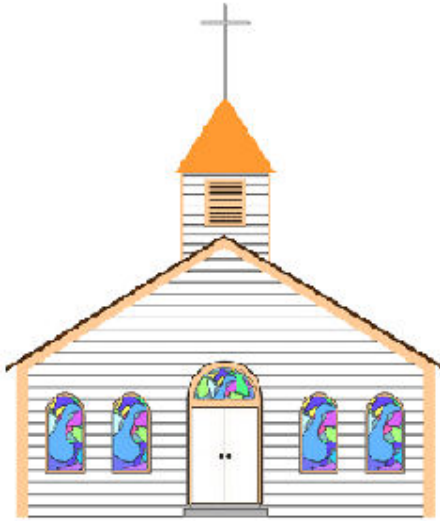
Dear Members and Friends of the Illinois District,

I'm thinking about a song from my college years. You're probably thinking, "Pastor, you're a dinosaur! Don't you know anything from this millennium???" Truth is, not really. In 1986 the group Timbuk3 released their one and only real hit: "The Future's So Bright I Gotta Wear Shades." And as I deliver an annual report for the 13th time this is the song on my mind. When it comes to the Church, that's the promise Jesus made. God and God's faithful will win in the end, and win big. One hymn writer described us as "victors in the midst of strife." That seems appropriate enough. The ultimate outcome has already been decided, but the battle still rages. The enemy keeps on hammering us with devastating blows, but we hold on to our faith and those we share that faith with and just keep going because the Power of God in us makes us strong enough to endure. We've recently purchased new equipment to assist those with hearing problems and a digital recording device so messages will be able to go out via the web or other electronic media. We've updated our membership records. We've got a strong board. I'm not being an alarmist, but I am meaning to sound an alarm, and nobody wants to hear an alarm. The church can keep on doing what it's doing – playing it safe and comfortable – and fade away in a few years' time or we can make some risky moves. Risky enough they might overwhelm us unless God intervenes. That will take desperate reliance on God like our lives depend on it – because they do. Bright futures always require seeking God like you've never sought Him before!

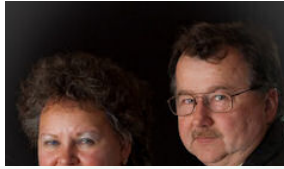

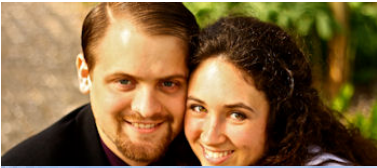

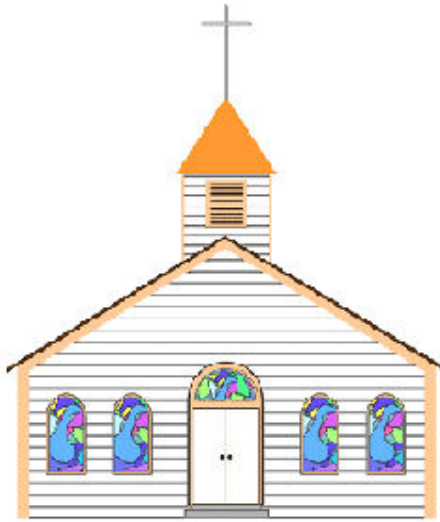

We believe the Guidance God has revealed to us this past year is a solid foundation for our future harvest and growth.

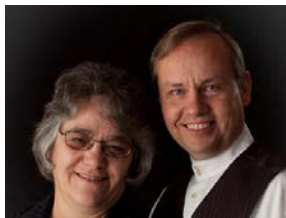

Olivet

I am honored to present to the Illinois District Assembly, my 22nd Annual Pastoral Report for the great and loving Olivet congregation.

Payment of all budgets in full for the 21st year consecutive year was not an easy assignment. At the last minute we were pushing hard to accomplish this and received some amazing support from some special church-connected friends.

Nearly \$20,000 was given directly to the Global Church Treasurer for missions support. With this additional giving, Olivet Church gave over 35% for World Mission support.

Olivet Church was blessed to have 2 missionaries minister in our church this past year: Rev. Dan and Melody Anderson from Uganda and Rev. Don and Eve Gardner from Nairobi, Kenya.

Through the faithful stewardship giving of our congregation we reduced our church indebtedness by \$16,000, now only owing around \$5,000 on our major sanctuary remodeling project.

We are continuing to experience growth with new families connecting to our congregation. In late fall, we welcomed the Rev. Scott Pittman family. Scott is an ordained elder in the church. His wife, Amanda, is a product of our church. In January the church leadership team appointed Scott as our Worship Leader. We now have a praise team with a band leading the Sunday morning service in praise choruses and great old hymns.

A new Sunday School class for younger adults was started in January. It is growing each week as Scott and Amanda serve as leaders. This group also meets weekly in a home-cell ministry team.

Our Women's Ministry participated in the Samaritan Christmas Shoe Box Ministry by providing 50 shoe boxes full of items to present to children in Third World Areas. The Women's Ministry also provided carry-in meals to assist families who have experienced surgeries.

A family in our small community was selected to receive a Christmas gift card to provide Christmas to their family of 10.

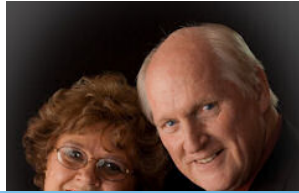
Our Youth Minister, Stephen Rippee is providing great leadership to the youth of our church, as well as to other youth in the area. They meet on Sunday nights and Wednesday nights. The church provided graduation gifts to 8 High School Graduates and two college graduates. 2 of our graduates are enrolled at ONU and begin classes in the fall.

A wonderful spirit prevails in our services as **we continue to proclaim the message of full salvation**. I am certainly honored to be serving this wonderful congregation. The church granted me a cost of living salary increase in April.

Greetings to Assembly Delegates for 2014. This is my third report for Pana First.

This past year we continued to focus on ministry essentials:

- **Teaching the Word of God, baptizing and discipleship of new believers
- **Introducing people to a relationship with Jesus Christ
- **Strengthening people's relationship with each other.
- **Helping people understand that holiness of heart and life is possible.
- **Engaging this community with our message of holiness.

Thanks to associate pastors Barbara Sheets and Lila Chaplin for their support and participation in the ministry of this church. Barbara's depth of understanding of the Bible and her teaching talents have improved the understanding of the Scriptures by those who have heard it taught. Lila Chaplin's prison ministry has taken God's Word outside the church into the prison system. As many as 100 men per week hear the message of our Lord.

This year we began a Mission Meals program that has fed the community of Pana on Wednesday evenings. Pana is an economically struggling community and we have provided meals for anyone wanting a free meal. The program began in November with an average of 30 and has grown to over 90 meals served per week. This program is running without any drain on church finances.

Church attendance and, therefore, finances have slipped this year and the new church board will have the task of turning these areas around. We will also begin Celebrate Recovery this year in an attempt to reach those with habits, hang ups and hurts in this community. Each year we become more and more community accessible.

This year Pana First Church will celebrate 90 years of ministry. The contribution of time and ministry by pastors and laity over these 90 years cannot be over emphasized. This is the only voice of holiness in this community and we take that very seriously.

Paris First

We have felt God's hand upon us this year. I started off the year with ten days in the hospital (two surgeries), so I figured it would get better, and it did! Because of this, revival services with Bob and Jennifer Wilkerson went on without me. We had a great revival and gave the Wilkerson's perhaps the largest revival offering ever raised by Paris 1st.

We had 120 people in attendance for rally day in October, 104 Father's Day, 107 December 15th despite several inches of snow. This may not sound like much to some, but five or six years ago, 45-50 people were coming, yet under the ministry of Rev. Ron and Patty Ingram, things started turning around, and God has continued an overall upward climb in the past few years during our pastorate. Vacation Bible School was another highlight with several outreach children attending.

The new D.O.T. (Diggers of Truth) program started last year on Wednesday nights continues to minister to a core group of about thirteen children and youth. Many of them are from unchurched families or sporadic families. God has done some amazing things. Our people are generous to the children, giving complete camp scholarships to six or seven children last summer, doing so again this summer.

We are still raising offerings for a fellowship hall/activity center, recently surpassing the \$20,000 mark, plus another \$21,000 in a certificate of deposit. We are not ready yet—still paying down the parsonage mortgage (early) in order to keep our indebtedness in check.

We had four funerals in ten days this spring, a hard time for our church, but God gave us many opportunities to minister.

The Paris church is one of the most "self-starting" churches I've ever pastored, and they do so much more than can be reported in a few paragraphs. Their concern for unsaved people is genuine. It is a privilege and a blessing to serve as their pastor.

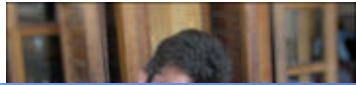
First and foremost we express our gratitude to God with praise for what we can report. The Scripture tells us that unless the “Lord Builds the House, we labour in vain.”

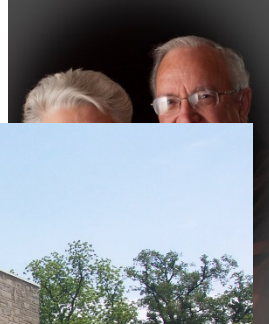

We installed a chair lift to the basement, built the FLC, acquired and rehabilitated the Roxana Ciné, remodeled practically every room in the church, added video projectors, computers, and screens to enhance worship, modified our worship style to continue to communicate Christ to a new audience, and upgraded the parsonage in several ways.

We have continued to house the best daycare anywhere, and enhanced its ministry when we moved it to this location. We have hosted the community for Trunk or Treat and a number of Spring Fun Days, have had basketball and volleyball leagues in our building and have had teams playing in the community in basketball, volleyball, and softball. We have even hosted district quizzing, District Celebrate Life and various other district meetings and events.

In these years we have built and maintained a vital missions involvement, a terrific youth ministry, served the older ones in our community through Men in Action, continued an effective Sunday School, enhanced our ministry to children, experienced J.O.Y. in many ways, established the House Church program, cared for each other through Telecare, learned to seek God in worship and prayer, and loved and supported each other in life and in death.

In worship, we have stretched our imaginations to think about our faith in new ways. Who would have ever thought Nazarenes would celebrate Lent with fasting, or observe Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, Maundy Thursday, and Easter Sunrise? We have had dramatic presentations for Maundy Thursday, reenacting the Last Supper or hearing from the Witnesses to Jesus. We have joined with the Ministerial Alliance for Good Friday services.

We have learned to stretch the Christmas season into Advent. We have decorated the church together during the Hanging of the Green service and journeyed to Bethlehem year after year as we have lit candles, shared the Word, and the music of the season.

Now, as we come to a fork in the road and head off on different paths, we are learning to maintain our faith, deepen our love, embrace our hope, and keep ourselves tuned into the Spirit. For, the God who has done so much for us in these past twenty years, still specializes in the impossible. If we keep our focus on Him, nothing will be beyond the realm of the possible. We still hold on to one purpose—seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness and all these things shall be added in to you.

Salem Grace Church of the Nazarene**

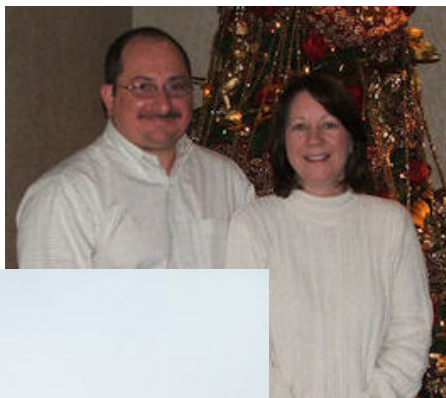
On April 24, 2014, The Hope House celebrated her first anniversary. What an evening it was! We sang our songs of freedom and praise, publically read the scriptures, and the twelve steps, and heard a dynamic testimony of recovery from a guest speaker. In this past year, we have experienced so many victories that rejoicing was easy and loud. The Hope House is home to Celebrate Recovery, a ministry with the mission of helping people to find healing and freedom from their “hurts, habits, and hang-ups” through the power of Jesus Christ. People come to The Hope House with addictions, hurts from past abuse, depression, relational issues, and codependency. They are greeted by people who, like them, have experienced their own brokenness, and have received grace and healing through Christ. Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered 12-step program that is very much a disciple-making process. Participants not only find freedom from that which has bound them, but also learn the disciplines of following Christ, learning his word, and witnessing to others along the way.

This year, The Hope House community has expanded their reach by adding “The Landing,” a recovery program for teens on Monday nights. We also offer “Celebration Station,” a pre-recovery program for children which meets at Grace Church on Thursday nights. We are excited to report that we have begun our first Step Studies (Small Group Meetings) in nearby Centralia, and are working in cooperation with the Ministerial Alliance there to begin another Large Group program (like The Hope House) in their community this fall.

In addition, we share Celebrate Recovery Inside weekly with the inmates of the Marion County Jail. From time to time, those that we first met there will show up at the front door of The Hope House. Some stay to become part of The Hope House family. They join Step Studies, share their stories, and sing with us. Primarily, they find out that the message on the outside of our house is true: HOPE LIVES HERE!

The church exists to bring glory to God. So, how have we done? As a church have we brought glory to God. It is hard to measure but if we were to measure by the Great Commandment and the Great Commission summarized in our Mission Statement "Seeking God's Heart, Extending His Hands." How have we done?

Seeking God's heart - This year we moved our prayer service to Tuesday night and started a discipleship time on Sunday evening. Over the past several months we have averaged 10-12 people praying on Tuesday night. It has been interesting to see the connection between the fervency of the prayer on Tuesday and the sense of God's presence in the service on Sunday. God has used that time of seeking Him to do His work. In August while many from our church were attending the district Prayer Encounter God was bringing Mary Ann to the realization of her need for Him. Through an amazing course of events Mary Ann came to the Prayer Encounter and that night went to the altar confirming a commitment of her life to Christ.

Besides the Tuesday evening prayer meetings we have been Seeking God in other ways. We had 10 attend The Awakening in Fort Worth, TX in October. As a church board we have been spending the first part of our meetings in prayer seeking the direction from Jesus Christ who is the Head of the church.

Extending His hands – After spending time in prayer in the spring, the Church Board discussed what God was laying on our hearts to do in obedience to Jesus' commands to make disciples. Some of the things, like a back-pack giveaway and a turkey giveaway required us to stretch and believe God would provide. God provided in a great way. We were able to give away 50 turkeys at cost of just over \$90 to the church. But most importantly, there were more than 70 people present that Saturday night to hear the gospel presented.

Due in large part to the different outreaches we now have several children attending on a regular basis. Virginia Clark, the grandmother of many of the kids who has been attending, committed her life to Christ after hearing the gospel for the first time in April.

Statistically we saw an encouraging change this year. After being down 10% last year with an average in worship of 77 we continued that trend well into this fiscal year. In September and October we had a monthly average attendance in the mid 60's. However, since November we have averaged 86 in worship.

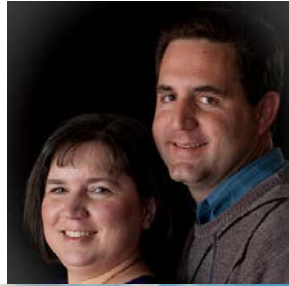
One of the most important numbers is the number of individuals who committed their lives to Christ. This year there were 5 that let us know and began some kind of follow up. I praise the Lord for those 5 individuals but think of the hundreds, if not thousands of people within a few miles of our church who need to hear about Jesus.

I am often reminded of the interdependency of God's work in the church. We are called to pray and commanded to make disciples. Both are dependent on the other. If we truly seek God in prayer we will not be able to keep from going out to make disciples, and we cannot begin to make true disciples of Christ unless we are praying and experiencing His presence in our midst.

As we seek God's plan for us to reach out I believe God has great things in store for us this year. As we begin a new year we need to continue to make prayer a high priority, praying for His presence in our midst and for workers for this harvest field. We need to understand how we are getting in His way and get out of His way. And then believe that He will bring the increase in our spiritual depth as well as helping us reach more people so that He might receive the glory.

of baptisms or conversions – 9 Baptisms and 9 re-dedications and more life-changing decisions of discipleship than can be counted.

Two new developments this past year included: 1. Community Reach – reaching out into the community through the Flea Market to develop relationships with people in the area. The primary purpose is to introduce people to Christ. This will begin May 31. 2. Pre-School Initiative: We have focused on 6 kids ages 3-4 who are not currently enrolled in preschool. The purpose is to teach them to trust and obey those who genuinely care for them and to introduce them to Jesus. The 6 kids have been very consistent in coming and as an added bonus, their parents have been behind it by having them ready on time each time.

Several goals for the coming year include: 1. Housing Initiative – Work closely with the appropriate people in St. Clair County to acquire 1-2 derelict houses. Ask a church to adopt a house, fix it up and then hand it over to an establish Board of volunteers who will closely with a single mom to take ownership of the house. 2. Volunteer Development – Promote the ministry at all times in order to broaden our volunteer base and then train the volunteers in an organized manner. 3. Evangelism Outreach – Work with like-minded Christians who are interested in inner-city outreach to share the message of Christ. 4. Donor development – Initiate one new fundraiser and improve the current Banquet in order to help keep a steady stream of income for the ministry (not there yet).

There were some faithful volunteers who left us to join the Church Triumphant and God sent us new volunteers who stepped up and said use my hands to be yours.

At the August 2013 annual meeting Beverly Ziegler was election Director of the Olney Mission Center and Sherry Gibson became her assistant, with Sherry Anderson being elected to the board.

The vision God gave us for the Soul in the mission field is stronger and ever as we see that day approaching when Jesus comes for His Church.

In August we started our second year at the Mission Center by become 501c3 not for Profit Corporation with a 9 member board from 6 different churches. God has opened Heaven windows and has flooded us with His grace and love. He has allowed us to reach out in His name to the lost, hurting people that need the love of Jesus more than the food we offer them. In September God called a Beverly Ziegler to resign her full time job and become the Assisted Director of The Master's Hands. In March The Master's Hands became an approved Nazarene Compassioned Ministers.

We have seen people coming to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior for the first time, we have saw people repent of their sins and come back to the Lord. There are 4 Bible studies each week, 1 worship/preaching service, and 2 recover type meeting. Between all the outreaches, the Bible studies, and the worship service we are allowed to share Jesus with about 3,500 people each month. A visitation ministers was started where our people visit home bound people. Many of these people their churches have forgotten about them over the years and no one comes to see them, others do not Christ as their Savior. In January we took over the School weekend back pack program for East Richland Schools and expanded it to also include all the schools of Richland County.

When there was a need for a 15 passenger van God sent a local business man and his wife to us he said "just to see what you are all about". After I gave them a tour of the place and we set and talk over coffee he asked, "Do you need a van" when I told him we did, with that he dropped a set of keys in front of me, pulled out the title and signed it over to us. Then he told me it was sitting just outside the back door. Every Sunday it picks up un-churched people and drops them off at the Church of their choice.

I was asked to preach at an Independent Holiness Church just outside of Olney, and after the service a couple give us a BMW Motorcycle that is worth about \$6,000.00 to sell and use it on a Woman Homeless Shelter. They also gave Sally and me a 2002 Buick auto. God knew that we needed a car. God gave us a house at 420 West Chestnut in April that we just got the deed to the property last week, that will be the new Woman Shelter that should be open about June of 2014.

The vision God gave us for souls in the Mission Field and The Master's Hands is catching, as our son Mark and his wife Sherry came along side of us purchased a building, remodel and equipped it for a coffee shop and food pantry. The doors were opened in April to The Master' Hands of Jasper County that is located in downtown on the square in Newton, IL. Sometime this fall we will start a worship/preaching service along with Bible studies at the Newton location.

Some of our people got the vision to ministers through a Community Garden, thus was born Rooted in Christ Community Garden that open the first of April. God gave us the land to use in the right location and the supplies we needed, and brought new people to us that we can share Jesus with.

We are seeking the Lord leading for a building that will house the clothing and household items that we now have in storage and give from as needed. We have a director for that minister that has said yes to the Lord when He called her.

In the month of April, just from the Olney location we were allowed to give about 69,000 lbs. of food away, with the help of 74 volunteers, working 2,341 hours. Plus we gave food to food pantries in 7 different counties, two senior centers, 1 children home, the Salvation Army, 1 woman shelter and two food banks in two states.

There are now 958 household on the rolls in Olney to receive food each month. Represented in these 958 household is 2,742 souls, of which 168 are babies, 573 are under 13 years of age, 1,124 are woman and about 70% do not go to Church.

When people ask us, "Where did you get all this food" after we unloaded 16 pallets of mushrooms, we just point them to our only source, that is Jesus our Lord and Savior, we give Him all the praise. We are thankful that He has allowed us to be a servant in His Kingdom work.

Our needs are many; from a 16ft. cargo trailer, to some type of Refrigeration trailer or truck, too much needed addition to our current building and general operating funds, for workers for the woman shelter and the list goes on and on.

God has opened the door for us to share Jesus to groups and Churches in Richland County and He has sent us churches that want to be a part in building His Kingdom. Thank you Lord. We are now working with some people in Effingham IL and we are looking forward to what God has for us in the next 12 months. We are looking forward to peaching His Word and pointing people to Jesus. We know whom we follow and we are looking forward to preaching and sharing Jesus with people. So little time, so many lost, so few workers, Lord send us workers!

Report to the District Assembly 2013-2014

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my seventh report as District Mission Strategy Director. I want to begin by expressing my gratitude to our District leadership: Thank you Dr. Spruce and Doug Haynes for your faithfulness, partnership, and friendship. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Philip Alvord, Mike Kraemer, Allen Ebbler, Kevin Hancock, Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, James Craig, Timothy Mondy, Will Haworth, and David Samayoa. We also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney, David Samayoa at Buen Samaritano in Collinsville, Rita Briggs in Jacksonville, and Clinton Smallwood, at Effingham. Towards the fulfillment of our mission, the Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$8,500 in grants this year.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days again this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastors Brian Powell and Mike Kraemer both challenged us with their preaching and teaching to believe that a NEW DAY is dawning for Christ's work here in Illinois. Special thanks to Randy Dodd, pastor and ONU professor for teaching workshops. To Decatur First, and Salem Grace for hosting us. And to Lara Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events. It was also notable that over 25 members of our Hispanic congregations were there for these events and we offered our first Spanish speaking track of workshops under their pastor's leadership. It is a NEW DAY indeed!

Just last year, we reported to you God's plan for launching our mission into the Hispanic communities of our District through the work of our new Hispanic Ministries Coordinator, David Samayoa. Pastor Kevin Hancock bore this vision in his heart and shared it with his congregation in Collinsville, who wholeheartedly agreed to welcome the Samayoas and their ministry into their church family. I'm happy to report to you that in February, Dr. Spruce and I were there to witness the launch of the new Buen Samaritano Iglesia del Nazareno with the Collinsville congregation. It was a joyous bilingual celebration of praise, attended and supported by members of the Arcola and Beardstown Spanish congregations. Pastors Waldo Perez, and Enrique Riofrio were there to sing and translate, along with many members of their congregations. It was a Spirit blessed time as the Arcos family became charter members of the new church, and as a man came forward after David's preaching to surrender his life to Christ. Please understand that David's ministry is not that of a singular church planter, but as a missionary, and so he has already begun seeking to begin new Hispanic congregations in Effingham and the Champaign areas. Please continue to pray and support the Samayoas as they continue their work this year.

Also last year, Dr. Spruce challenged all of our churches to attend a DCPI Church Planting seminar within two years. In the last year, 35 of our churches, almost one-half, and 48 of our pastors, have have attended one or more training seminars. Five of our pastors are classified as Certified Trainers, who can reteach this material to others: Willard Anderson, James Craig, David Samayoa, Rita Briggs, and Kevin Pittman. Three of our pastors have qualified as Master Trainers, who can certify new trainers: Mike Kraemer, Will Haworth, and I. Dr. Spruce has also completed his certification as a Master Trainer. Though we realize that this is only

the classroom part of church planting, we believe we are laying the groundwork for a church planting movement on our District. The fact that both our Hispanic work in Collinsville, and our latest work in Effingham were envisioned during these training events, testifies to that fact.

We already have our next training event planned for September 22-26 at Belleville First. If you are a pastor, and have not attended one of these events, please plan on doing so, and if you have someone on your staff or in your congregation who may be called to be a church planter, bring them with you. The District has again made these events affordable to all by paying all registration fees, and reimbursing lodging expenses for all participants from our District. We continue to see a Church Planting Movement on the horizon of our District's future. To be part of this, we must first multiply disciples, as Christ called us to do. Then, we must discern those disciples who are gifted and called to leadership, and provide training for their multiplication as well. Ultimately, the planning of new churches will be the result of disciples, and leaders set apart and sent by the Spirit to begin new churches among the lost.

Through the work of Bill Wiesman, and his Prayer Task Force, this movement has already begun. We don't want to allow what God is doing to pass us by here in Illinois. So pastors and leaders, here's what you can do: Pray, support, or send your people in the effort to start new churches. If you share in the labor, you'll share in the joy of the harvest! It's a new day ... let's meet it with a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois!

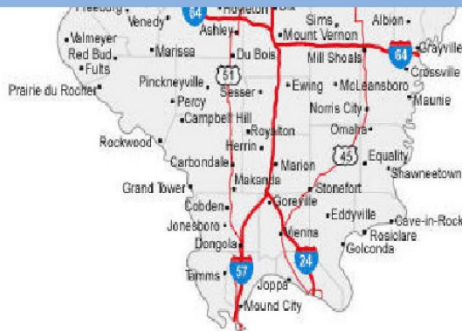

1. Advisory Board and Church Properties Board

The District Advisory Board convened six face-to-face meetings and conducted many items of business via conference calls and email voting.

Credentials transferred out included: Elders – Christopher L. Breeden to Southwest Indiana; Jim High to Eastern Kentucky; Lawrence Lacher to New Mexico; Timothy M. Lourash to Oregon Pacific; David Young to New England; Licensed Ministers - Travis William Jackson to Wisconsin; Benjamin Jason Thelander to Missouri.

The DAB recommended the following for renewal of District Minister's Licenses: Dwayne Keith Anderson, Michael A. Flowers, Thomas Higgins, Tim Mezera, Ralph Foreman.

The board granted retired status to: Gary E. Farris, Michael E. Cutis, James R. Spruce, Michael L. Tapscott

The board approved the following pastoral appointments made by the District Superintendent:

St.Louis Rush Memorial, Carl Pinkston; Fairfield, Norlyn Crandall; Lincoln, Greg Wooten; Mansfield, Carlos Lonberger; Mt. Carmel, (supply TBD); Mt. Erie, Kevin Pittman; Mt. Sterling, Stan Cooley; Oakwood, Bill Connell; Sparta, Keith Anderson; Tuscola, Jo Carter; Urbana Lighthouse, Wayne Clevenger; Virden, Steve Gocking; West Union, John Cody

The board voted to approve the DAB Secretary to sign legal documents. In the absence of the District Superintendent or DAB Secretary, it authorized the Administrative Assistant to sign all legal documents. The board authorized the Administrative Assistant, also, to sign for the listing and sale of properties for the district.

The board voted to change the status of the Harrisburg Church from the "appointed" status to the "called" status.

The board voted to approve a loan of \$500 to Hispanic Director David Samayoa.

The board voted to approve a loan by the Rantoul Church in the amount of \$50,000 for repairs to the church building.

The board voted to approve the guarantee of the loan renewal for the Mount Carmel church in the amount of \$136,000.

The board voted to give \$4750 to subsidize each camp (Children's Camp and Teen Camp) for a total of \$9500.

The board accepted the "Proposal for Transitional Leadership Organization" requested by the Mattoon Real Life Church, to be reviewed yearly.

The DAB voted to present a Resolution to the District Assembly to appoint the Finance Committee as a Budget preparation subcommittee, and that the Full Finance Committee also include the pastor and one layman from each church who attend.

The board approved the District Budget.

The board voted to affirm Bill Shotts as Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee.

The board appointed Larry Lacher as Secretary of the DAB. The board appointed Jay Shoff as temporary Chair, in the absence of the District Superintendent.

The DAB voted to terminate salary for Tim Young, Jr. at the anniversary date of his hiring.

The board voted to allow the Tim Young family to remain in the parsonage at Granite City, cost-free until Oct. 1, 2013. The board later voted to allow the Youngs to remain in the parsonage until Jan. 1, 2014, but that they be responsible for all utilities beginning Nov. 1, 2013.

The board voted to order a market analysis of the Granite City parsonage and to retain a rental manager to manage the property. The board authorized the D.S. and Associate to prepare the Granite City property for rental, including authorizing any repairs needed.

The board voted to return checks to people who could not attend the Christmas party due to the weather.

The board voted to modify the Christmas Banquet to conserve funds.

The board voted to appoint Jon Kroeze to fill the vacancy by Larry Lacher's resignation from the DAB.

The board appointed Fred Prince to replace Larry Lacher as ONU trustee.

The DAB voted to pull the Effingham properties from the market for a period of one year, to allow The Smallwoods to use the parsonage (through Jan. 1, 2014) to begin a New Start - to be reviewed within the year. Doug Haynes was authorized to work with the contract and realtor to compensate him fairly for his efforts on our behalf.

The board approved the sale of the Taylorville parsonage.

The board approved the sale of the associate's parsonage at Decatur West Side church.

The board established as DAB Policy that: a minimum of 25% of the proceeds from the sale of any parsonage be retained in a restricted account to be used for future pastoral housing.

The board approved the nominating committee for 2014.

The DAB voted to host a reception for the Spruces at their retirement - and to present them a check for \$11,000, in acknowledgement of their eleven years of service to the IL District.

The board also voted to give to Dr. Spruce the vehicle he has been driving - also the computer, laptop and printer he and Karen have been using.

The DAB solicited prayer power from the entire District - for the Spruces, and for our search for God's man/woman for our new D.S.

The board voted to request that Doug Haynes submit his letter of resignation effective thirty days after the District Assembly - but that he remain in his District position through the interim period of establishing a new D.S. - for ninety days beyond the District Assembly.

The board voted to accept Mark Copley's resignation - and ask that he remain in his position for ninety days after the District Assembly.

The board voted to allow Dr. Spruce (with the DAB) to evaluate the Hispanic Ministries program and determine if and how long that contract will be extended. (Contract ends May 23, 2014.)

The board appointed Doug Haynes to assist Dr. Spruce in completing an inventory of items in the District Office.

The board voted to recommend to the Finance Committee that they add 5% compensation to the financial package offered to the D.S. Candidate. The base salary is \$67,000; actual compensation amounts to \$95,000.

The board voted to approve the sale of the Decatur West Side property to Akorn Pharmaceutical for \$750,000.

The board voted to approve the purchase by Decatur West Side of property on Hwy 36, Decatur, IL, for \$725,000.

B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons-Christian education, deacons-compassionate ministries, deacons-music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the Manual, **231.1**; **529.4**.

Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (Handbook of Ministerial Studies).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in **Sourcebook on Ordination, Manual 525.1**.

Modes of Study

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.
2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
3. Nazarene Bible College: Pursuing a degree in a religious major approved/validated by Nazarene Clergy Services.
4. Northwest Nazarene University: Online COS – Course of Study Module
5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track, MPP Track.

6. A Nazarene District School of Ministry: Module Course
7. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study (Subject to evaluation).

The Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual; **527.3-527.5**. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the Sourcebook for Ministerial Development. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (<http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/>) A Candidate Handbook can be downloaded for free from (<http://usacanadaregion.org/clergy-education>) .

2. Each student is encouraged to take **four** courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed to allow a student to continue. However, **“To qualify for ordination, candidates must achieve graduation from a validated course of study within 10 years from the granting of the first district license...”** Manual **530.4**. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.

3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.

4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. **Complete enrollment information and all necessary forms for enrollment in the course of study with the Studies Board may be found at: <http://ministerialstudies.illinoisnaz.org/>.**

5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate.

6. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

7. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The District is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

8. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings will be scheduled by the district office and notification of the meetings will be sent to you.

9. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

10. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with Manual, **527.3, 527.5**.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with Manual, **527.3; 527.5**. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. **The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.**

D. CONTINUING EDUCATION

"Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU's)) (Manual **527.6**). In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU's by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU's are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant's responsibility to qualify him/herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the Office of Ministry. All records of CEU's obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

Mission Strategy Team Report to the District Assembly 2013-2014

Members and friends of the assembly, it is my privilege to present to you my seventh report as chairman of the District Mission Strategy Team. The Mission Strategy Team this year included the following members: Dr. James R. Spruce, chairman (ex-officio); Mark Copley, Mission Strategy Director; Philip Alvord, Mike Kraemer, Allen Ebber, Kevin Hancock, Rita Briggs, Wayne Clevenger, Craig Dillman, James Craig, Timothy Mondy, Will Haworth, and David Samayoa. We also want to acknowledge our church planters and new works that are active on our District: Willard Anderson at The Master's Hands (Compassionate Ministries Center) in Olney, David Samayoa at Buen Samaritano in Collinsville, Rita Briggs in Jacksonville, and Clinton Smallwood, at Effingham. Towards the fulfillment of our mission, Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$8,500 in grants this year.

In 2013, Dr. Spruce challenged all of our churches to attend a DCPI Church Planting seminar within two years. In the last year, 35 of our churches, almost one-half, and 48 of our pastors, have have attended one or more training seminars. Five of our pastors are classified as Certified Trainers, who can reteach this material to others: Willard Anderson, James Craig, David Samayoa, Rita Briggs, and Kevin Pittman. Three of our pastors have qualified as Master Trainers, who can certify new trainers: Mark Copley, Mike Kraemer, and Will Haworth. Dr. Spruce has also completed his certification as a Master Trainer. Though we realize that this is only the classroom part of church planting, we believe we are laying the groundwork for a church planting movement on our District. The fact that both our Hispanic work in Collinsville, and our latest work in Effingham were envisioned out of these events, testifies to that fact. We already have our next training event planned for September 22-26 at Belleville First. If you are a pastor, and have not attended one of these events, please plan on doing so, and if you have someone on your staff or in your congregation is a potential church planter, bring them with you. The District has again made these events affordable to all by paying all registration fees, and reimbursing lodging expenses for all participants from our District.

Last year, we reported to you God's plan for launching our mission into the Hispanic communities of our District through the work of our new Hispanic Ministries Coordinator, David Samayoa. Pastor Kevin Hancock bore this vision in his heart and shared it with his congregation in Collinsville, who wholeheartedly agreed to welcome the Samayoas and their ministry into their church family. I'm happy to report to you that in February, Dr. Spruce and I were there to witness the launch of the new Buen Samaritano Iglesia del Nazareno with the Collinsville church. It was a joyous bilingual celebration of praise, attended and supported by members of the Arcola and Beardstown Spanish congregations. Pastors Waldo Perez, and Enrique Riofrio were there to sing and translate. It was a Spirit blessed time as the Arcos family became charter members of the new church, and as a man came forward after David's preaching to surrender his life to Christ. Understand that David's ministry is not that of a singular church planter, but as a missionary, and so he has already begun seeking to begin new Hispanic congregations in Effingham and the Champaign areas. Please continue to pray and support the Samayoas as they continue their work this year.

We again enjoyed successful Team Days again this year in both Decatur and Salem. Pastors Brian Powell and Mike Kraemer both challenged us with their preaching and teaching to believe that a NEW DAY is dawning for Christ's work here in Illinois. Special thanks to Randy Dodd, pastor and ONU professor for teaching workshops. To Decatur First, and Salem Grace for hosting us. And to Lara Mondy and her volunteers who planned and worked hard to organize these important events. It was notable that over 25 members of our Hispanic congregations were there for these events and we offered our first Spanish speaking track of workshops under their pastor's leadership. It is a NEW DAY indeed!

The Mission Strategy Team reemphasizes the following goals:

- ***Each church developing opportunities for weekly corporate prayer seeking to honor God's presence and seek His will for their community and the district.***

- ***Each church developing a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.***
- ***Each pastor involved in a coaching movement and intentionally connecting with other pastors.***
- ***Each church striving for “Church Health” using the Church Health Survey and the Natural Church Development process.***
- ***Each church embracing a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in church multiplication.***

We believe that the events of this year have moved us closer to these goals, and that the vision for “a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois” is coming into view. We continue to pray and seek the fulfillment of our mission, ***“To become healthy, missional churches and pastors in order to make Christlike disciples in Illinois.”***

Christ is calling us to join him in making Christlike disciples in the nations. As a District, we must follow Him into the new day that he is creating for his Church in Illinois.

Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

1. In accordance with the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center that all budget payments be based on Church Income. Church Income (Qualified Income for Illinois District purposes) is defined as all income eligible under IRS guidelines for a tax deduction, reduced by payments made to the World Evangelism Fund, payments made for approved 10% specials, deductions for rare circumstances, phase in adjustments, and any other deduction allowed by the General Church of the Nazarene Global Ministry Center.
2. That the Illinois District Budget be a unified budget with a single budget payment to include district administration and operations, NMI, NYI, and SDMI. All budget payments to be allocated to each department based on their pro-rata portion of budget receipts. Budget payments should be sent to William E. Shotts unified district treasurer.
3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of Church Income, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 2.25 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 2.25 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 5.85 percent.
4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on an amount equal to or greater than 10% of Church Income, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials (missions giving).

5. That the Unified District Funds be allocated as follows:

Unified District	88.61%
NMI	2.24%
NYI	6.27%
SDMI	2.88%

6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, and Pensions and Benefits) be calculated and paid weekly beginning in May.
7. That only churches which have paid in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, and the World Evangelism Fund, be permitted to report all funds paid in full.
8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the District Superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board. (Manual, par. 235.4).
9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with (Manual, par. 129.6 & 129.7). Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
10. That every church adopt a written "Designated Gift Policy". Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a designated gift policy, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.
11. That **October 5, 2014**, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.
12. That **December 7, 2014**, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the General Treasurer in Kansas City immediately.

13. That **January 11, 2015**, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the Seminary in Kansas City immediately.
14. That **April 19, 2015**, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our District Treasurer for Olivet.
15. That the salary of the district superintendent be **\$73,500.00** annually, plus **\$10,075.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, SE payments of **\$14,843.00** and **\$1,050.00** annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.
16. That the salary of the Administrative Assistant be **\$45,265.00** annually, plus **\$3,294.00** annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, Housing allowance of **\$13,800.00**, SE payments of **\$9,556.16** and that he be given vacation in accordance with manual guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.
17. That the salary of the District Missionary be **\$23,303.00** and SE payments of **\$3,762.22** annually.
18. That the salary of the Hispanic Coordinator be **\$26,300.00** annually, **\$1,200.00** in a tax-sheltered annuity, housing allowance of **\$10,000.00**, and SE payments of **\$5,129.03** as established by contractual agreement.
19. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.
20. That the District advisory Board be authorized to provide a district owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the travel and expenses, for the administrative assistant.
21. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the District Missionary.
22. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the Hispanic Coordinator.
23. That the district boards' committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.
24. That the honorarium for the district secretary be **\$4,010.20** per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.
25. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund, NMI, NMI, and SDMI be **\$51,912.00** per year.

26. That a recommended rate of \$8.25 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.
27. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.
28. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests. **That our churches be encouraged to utilize the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, or charitable trusts. 29. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the Manual, Pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.
30. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (Manual, par. 135.4).

Christian Cultural Engagement

- A. WHEREAS, in times when our culture desperately needs the Church to be a living example of Christ-like holiness and love, we strongly urge:
1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship, the receiving of the Sacraments and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are primary Means of Grace by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
 2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22- 24).
 3. That the church manual be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (Manual, Part II, para 1-22, pgs. 28-37) and the Covenant of Christian Character (Manual, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 38- 40) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
 4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
 5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Eph 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian Ethics, 104 entertainment, Marriage & Divorce, Abortion, Human Sexuality, Christian Stewardship, etc. (Manual, Part III, para 33-41, pgs 46-60).
- B. WHEREAS, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

Believing that ministry in the life of a Christian is based upon who we are in Christ, not merely the activities that we engage in, we encourage our people to see their world through the eyes of Jesus, to seek out opportunities for love and service at home and at work, within their local church as well as in the larger community. We also encourage our people to work with and in public

institutions as a means of Christ-like engagement with our culture on the local, State, National, and Global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide opportunities for Christ-like service such as:
 - a. Ministries to the vulnerable, marginalized, and hurting within one's own congregation, believing that Christian love demonstrated toward those within our own fellowship is one way that Christ's love is made evident to the culture around us.
 - b. Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the community.

2. Along with engaging in acts of love and service through the local church, we must encourage our people to bring the same acts of kindness into their workplaces and homes. In understanding that Christ has called not only pastors, but in fact all Christians to be salt and light in the world, we must encourage our people to not look at their homes and workplaces as mundane and trivial, but as places to which they have been called to bring the love and hope of Jesus. We must understand that being a missional church is not something we do only corporately, but something we do individually, every day as we live our lives as salt and light in this dark and broken world.
3. Our people should show Christian stewardship by becoming involved in civic, community and school functions and cooperating with other churches and civic agencies who share our ministry objectives. Our pastors, youth workers and parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:
 - a. Pregnancy Resource Centers
 - b. Homeless Shelters
 - c. Habitat for Humanity
 - d. Credible Christian Counseling Centers
 - e. Food & Clothing Pantries such as Hopeful Hearts Ministries in Decatur, the Good Samaritan Ministries Center in the 105 Metro-East and The Master's Hand in Olney and Newton

along with multiple food pantries in local churches throughout the district.

- f. Nursing Homes; Senior Adult Organizations
 - g. Appropriate Parent/Teacher Organizations (Resources: Nazarene Compassionate Ministries; Focus on the Family; Salvation Army; Nazarene Ethnic Ministries; Illinois Family Institute, 799 Roosevelt Road, Building 3, Suite 208, Glen Ellyn, IL; Toll free: (800- FAMILY-1); Fax:(630) 790-8390; Email: info@illinoisfamily.org).
4. We should actively monitor our State and Federal Legislature on issues which pertain to, and affect our church and community and express appreciation to individuals/organizations that promote legislature and programs which edify. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association. Therefore, we urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of prayer for all elected officials. We also call our people to thoughtful participation in local, state and national politics, especially pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice while also wholeheartedly acknowledging that the politics of this world are not the politics of the kingdom of God.

Church Growth

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

Commission

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. Scripture is very clear that our primary motivation in church growth is seeing souls saved and disciplined in Christ Jesus.

Prayer

Prayer is the foundation for all church growth. Without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year. We recommend that each local church do their best to support the District sponsored Prayer Summits and Encounters.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. We recommend that these three key elements be presented to the local congregation on a regular basis to ensure continued focus on God's plan, mission and vision for the local church.

Responsibility List

That every church maintain an accurate and detailed responsibility list. We also encourage each congregation to actively and regularly contact, nurture, and disciple those that they have claimed responsibility for.

Calling

That absentees be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

Discipleship

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of entire sanctification which leads to continued spiritual growth, productive service, inspirational witness in the Christian life

Lay Ministry

We encourage each local church to seek creative ways to provide for and promote Christian service and ministry opportunities within the church and community.

Education

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

Evangelism

That each local congregation seek to evangelize their community with the vision of seeing souls saved and lives changed by the grace and glory of God. That innovative and creative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored and implemented.

New Church Starts

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should be prayerfully involved in creating or supporting new church starts. That each pastor promote and attend the Church Planting Essentials and Churches Planting Churches DCPI training. That prayer, funding, and personal involvement in new church plants be part of the local church mission statement and vision.

Personal Evangelism

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism as well as develop a mentoring support plan for the discipleship of new converts.

Revivals

We encourage our churches to plan for and facilitate annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene.

Servant Evangelism

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. That the local church look for creative and helpful ways to be a blessing to the community it ministers to.

Finances

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Evangelism Committee

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism and Church Membership Committee as stated in the 2009-2013 *Manual*, page 71, and section 110-110.8.

Global Church Growth Award

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

The purpose of the General Superintendents' Growth Award (GSGA) is to give prominence to those practices that are central to the local and worldwide advancement of the church; specifically, new Nazarenes, significant involvement in sponsoring a new church, and 100% participation in fund allocations.

- Churches that win people to Christ are healthy.
- Starting new churches is the most effective means of evangelism known to the church.
- Fund allocations are essential to the cooperative ministries of the Church of the Nazarene.

- I. New Nazarenes requirements are based on 10% of attendance for the current year.
- II. The meaning of "significant involvement in sponsoring a new church" is very specific and is spelled out in the Sponsorship Criteria Worksheet. This worksheet is available online.
- III. Full participation in fund allocations includes district assignment, educational support, pensions (applicable to US only), and World Evangelism Fund.
 - The requirements for receiving this award are intentionally high—it is special recognition by the Board of General Superintendents.
 - It is not based on attendance or membership.
 - This award is not intended to replace all awards.

This award is given in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in essential practices of the expansion of the kingdom of God through the Church of the Nazarene. The presentation of this award is intended to say "Thank You" to the receiving pastor and church, and to elevate in the consciousness of our people the compelling importance of winning people to Christ, starting new churches, and supporting the organizational structures that make possible evangelism around the world.

Ministerial Staff Support

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Senior Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

I. For the Pastor

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of **\$ 475** per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.
2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.

B. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar

year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.

2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from General Headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.

C. Concerning Housing:

1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance. **Utilities shall include heat, water, sewer, electric, gas, internet, and trash pickup at a minimum.**
2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
3. That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
5. That the Board of Trustees **or Church Board** of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.

6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.

D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
2. That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.
3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
 - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
 - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
 - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
 - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation
(District Assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in Teen or Children's Camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)

A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.

4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
 5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.
- B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing
1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
 2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.
- C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
 2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
 3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

III. For Retired Ministerial Staff

- A. Concerning Reimbursements:
1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.
- B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare
1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.
 2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2014, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures

selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As explained in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the District has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church New Start, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2014, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Other Matters

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows – modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 27 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the District. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

Home Mission – This program was established to assist churches in need.

Camp Ground – This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees / users.

Olivet Nazarene University – This program was established to provide Olivet Nazarene University with assistance in the collection of budgeted funds from local churches.

Medical – This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.

Nazarene Missions International – This program was established to provide support for Missionaries approved by the General Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.

Church New Start – This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.

Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.

Nazarene Youth International – This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) *are not recorded* in these financial statements.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(Continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all highly liquid investment instruments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. The District carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis.

Property and Equipment

The District has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

Income Taxes

The District is exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the District has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers between Program Accounts

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses – Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

NOTE 2 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The District maintains multiple accounts at various financial institutions. Accounts at these institutions are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). There was no excess of the FDIC limit as of April 30, 2014.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2014 are summarized as follows:

NOTE 4 – LOANS RECEIVABLE

The District occasionally loans individual churches that are struggling financially monies to pay operating expenses (utility bills, insurance, repairs and salaries). These interest free loans are repaid by the individual churches as funds become available (recovery or selling of assets).
