





#### World Evangelism Fund (WEF)

#### What Is the World Evangelism Fund?

The World Evangelism Fund is the cooperative genius of the mission enterprise of the Church of the Nazarene. It is based on the concept that we can do more working together than could ever be done working alone.

#### Why do we have World Evangelism Fund?

Missions in the Church of the Nazarene is a large enterprise. To accomplish the Great Commission—spreading the gospel and the message of holiness around the world—requires money.

In "faith-based" missions, missionaries must spend valuable time raising financial support. They conduct services, take offerings, receive pledges of support, and then pray the amount raised covers living expenses. Sometimes if the money runs out, missionaries are forced to return home.

In this type of support, churches do not always share equally in the mission work. Larger churches are sometimes visited by more missionaries than they could possibly help, while some smaller churches are overlooked.

The World Evangelism Fund was created to allow missionaries to work more effectively and to encourage all churches to support missions.

The World Evangelism Fund goes directly toward accomplishing the mission of the Church of the Nazarene, to make Christlike disciples in the nations. The World Evangelism Fund is the funding that operates the Church of the Nazarene and its entire mission effort, from the operation of the Global Ministry Center to districts and churches around the world. Tragedy in the midst of service Monday, February 13, 2012 Bleck, Haiti By NCN News Staff

A Work and Witness team from the Fergus Falls, Minnesota, Church of the Nazarene was putting the finishing touches on rebuilding a clinic in Haiti last Saturday morning when tragedy struck.

Paul Dennis, a 52-year-old known for his love of helping others, was hurt in a construction accident and was not able to recover from his injuries. He passed away shortly after the accident despite receiving immediate medical attention from doctors who were part of the team.

Fergus Falls pastor Steven Hoffman was part of the Work and Witness team and was present to counsel team members. The group, who was in Bleck near the Dominican Republic border, conducted outreach projects later that day before returning Sunday to Port-au-Prince as scheduled.

They returned home to Minnesota on Wednesday.

Dennis recently served the Prairie Lakes District as Nazarene Missions International president and deputation coordinator. He was Minnesota's NMI district president for a year before the Dakota and Minnesota districts became the Prairie Lakes District.

He is survived by his wife Lori, who did not make the trip, and two children, Meghan (Hunter) Matt and Jeremy (Beth).

The Dennis family asked that, in lieu of flowers, contributions be made to Work and Witness, Church of the Nazarene. Prayer is requested for the Dennis family and members of the Fergus Falls team.

The plans for the **Spring Deputation Tour** are tentative but as it stands now we will be blessed by having Dave and Marquita Mosher who are presently serving in Malawi. The tentative dates are May 7 - 18, 2012. Deputation Coordinator, Sandy Stickler is presently working out the details. If you have questions, Sandy can be reached at 217-508-7265.

David and Marquita Mosher are global missionaries for the Church of the Nazarene serving in Zambia, Africa since 2008. Previous to this assignment they served in Sao Tome and Principe.


Their assignment in Zambia includes assisting in pastoral leadership training on two districts. David serves as field treasurer and Marquita assists in training children's ministry leaders.

The Moshers began their missionary service in the Kingdom of Swaziland in 1983. They spent 10 years working at Siteki Nazarene High School. They also assisted at the Nazarene Bible College and were involved in outstation church work on the weekends.

In 1994, the Moshers were assigned to the northern provinces of Nampula, Niassa and Cabo Delgado in Mozambique. Their ministry involved training lay leaders as well as directing church planting and training of church leaders. The main work there was among the Macua tribe, which was the largest unreached people group in Africa at that time. The Moshers served in Mozambique until assigned to Sao Tome and Principe in 2001.

David received a B.S. from Southern Nazarene University, in Bethany, Oklahoma. He received an M.A. in missiology from Nazarene Theological Seminary in 1993. Marquita received a B.A. in religion from Southern Nazarene University. David and Marquita were both ordained in Maputo, Mozambique, in 1996.

The Moshers have two adult children, LeCrecia and David C.

First, thank you all for your notes of sympathy and assurances of prayer for my family and myself in the passing of my mother. As I have told those I have spoken to in the past couple of days; she isn't tired anymore, but rejoicing with my father and others of her family in heaven.


She is there because someone was faithful to invite a new family in the neighborhood to Sunday School, we went. Then the "church" (you know, the laypeople) followed up, making sure we were welcomed; inviting us back, individually, for the various activities of the church. They even called on us in our home! We had faithful Sunday School teachers (lay people again) teaching us the truth from God's word in Sunday school, NYPS (for me) and children's activities (for my little sister) while the pastor did his part in calling on us and preaching the truth. Over time I came to know the Lord, then my sister, then mom. It would take 20 years of the church and us praying for him before dad came to the Lord, even then he was led in a simple prayer of confession by a faithful layman. After she was saved mom was asked to help with and then teach children's Sunday School and work with the "whirly birds" group.

Today my sister is a pastor's wife (she has also held children's crusades over the years, taught Sunday School and Bible School) and I have worked with teens for the past 39 years. Wow, that almost sounds like what Manual Paragraph 145.2 says the mission of the SDMI is doesn't it? It reads as follows:

"To reach the largest number of unchurched people for Christ and the church, bringing them into the fellowship, teaching the Word of God effectively, and encompassing their salvation; teaching the doctrines of the Christian faith and developing Christlike character, attitudes, and habits; helping to establish Christian homes; preparing believers for membership in the church and equipping them for appropriate Christian ministries."

Ok, so I took some liberties with the "bold" print. The point is, this is what SDMI is supposed to be about. Over the next few months I hope to, along with input from others, let you know of some tools that are available to you and encourage you to fulfill this mission. After all, you never know who the next Sunday school teacher may be, which one will influence your child, pray for you or lead your family member to Christ.

#### How does the World Evangelism Fund work?

Full-time missionaries (excluding volunteers) in the Church of the Nazarene receive a monthly paycheck based on a standard amount plus a cost-of-living adjustment.

Missionaries also receive medical insurance (see <u>Missionary Health Care</u>) a pension provision, and other items (such as housing and travel costs).

The World Evangelism Fund comes from the generosity of Nazarenes around the world. Each church is challenged to contribute an assigned apportionment, but many, seeing the effectiveness of the world mission enterprise, choose to overpay.

#### How is the World Evangelism Fund collected?

Traditionally, it has been through two large offerings a year—the <u>Thanksgiving</u> and <u>Easter</u> offerings. Some churches continue to successfully raise their entire fund this way.

<u>Faith Promise</u> is a plan based on mission giving at systematic intervals rather than just twice a year. Through Faith Promise, people pray about the amount they should give for missions (over and above their tithe). The amount is often given weekly, biweekly, or monthly. Over time, churches find they raise their mission support and often go over their goal through this giving plan.

#### The Benefits of the World Evangelism Fund

**Missionaries**—They receive a regular paycheck, freeing them from the added worry of raising finances. Missionaries still write letters and conduct deputation services to inform people of happenings in their field of service; however, such activities do not consume a large portion of their time on the mission field.

**Churches**—Regardless of size, each church has the opportunity to take part in the global mission endeavor. Also, just as individuals are blessed by God when they commit a portion of their resources for His kingdom, so churches are blessed when they allocate funds to help reach the lost around the world.

#### What is a Church of Excellence?

A Church of Excellence is a church that gives at least 5.7% or \$1,500 above 5.5% of current income for the World Evangelism Fund.

In an effort to encourage further giving to World Evangelism Fund, the Board of General Superintendents, at the suggestion of the General NMI Council, approved that "All moneys overpaid by the local church toward the World Evangelism Fund are used to explore and enter new world areas." (Handbook and Constitution)

## Saying "YES" for Lent

"Whatever God has promised gets stamped with the Yes of Jesus. In him, this is what we preach and pray, the great Amen, God's Yes and our Yes together, gloriously evident." -- 2 Corinthians 1:20 TM

What are you "giving up" for Lent? Last Wednesday, Christians around the world began the Lenten season, many choosing to prepare their hearts during this season leading to Good Friday by fasting, or denying themselves some nutrition or pleasure. Some refrain from choice meats (have you noticed all the "fish sandwich" commercials recently?), but sodas, or chocolates are often forsaken as well. I've done some of this myself over the years -- the worst being giving up coffee last year – and God has always blessed. Fasting for long periods of time, and seeking God in prayer, are always good things if done for the right reasons, and in faith.

But this year, God has given me a new "fast" to pursue under his care. This year, during Lent, I'm giving up "control". That is, my "right" to decide what invitations and opportunities to accept or decline. I'm committing myself to say "Yes" beforehand to all such offers.

#### Why am I doing this?

- 1. **Too often I have used favoritism in making these decisions.** Jesus said, "If you love only those who love you, what good is that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much. If you are kind only to your friends, how are you different from anyone else? Even pagans do that." (Matthew 5:46-47) This season, I want to say yes not only to my "friends," but those who have the potential to become friends. And that means everyone.
- 2. I want to be more like Jesus. Only moments after calling Matthew, a notorious tax collector, to follow him, Jesus accepted an invitation to dine with him and his friends at his place. Of course, tax collectors and sinners have friends who are tax collectors and sinners, and Jesus said "yes" to their fellowship. I want to experience fellowship outside of my normal Christian circles, and "holy huddles." Perhaps this commitment will make those opportunities possible.
- 3. I want to stretch and grow. Spiritual growth does not come without discomfort. Lenten fasting is one example of this. In this kind of "reverse fast," I want to, by surrendering control, open myself up to uncomfortable situations where I must lean all the more heavily on Christ, and the comforter himself the Holy Spirit.
- 4. I'm in a new situation and I need to make new friends. My wife and I just moved to Salem, Illinois where we are now living and attending Grace Church. We are already loving and being loved by the congregation here, but we know most only "from a distance." We want to get beyond the handshake in the lobby, and hear their stories, and maybe share a few of ours. By saying yes beforehand, I won't miss any invitation to do so because I'm tempted to say I'm too busy, or too tired.
- 5. I'm not "too busy." This conviction came to me a few years ago, when I realized that saying this as an excuse to refuse invitations means, "There are things I have to do that are more important to me than you are." God also revealed to me the pride that lies behind saying I'm "too busy." Busyness has become a "status symbol" indicating "importance" in our society. One of the most caring things we can say to someone is "Yes, I have time for you. I am not too busy to listen."

#### Some questions you may be asking:

**Will I say yes to everything?** Of course not. I will not say yes to anything sinful, or anything that the Lord's leading will not allow of me. I'm also reserving the right to say no to people (mostly my Christian friends) who have resolved to "put me to the test" with silly requests. I'm surrendering my will to Christ and his Lordship, not trying to recreate the Jim Carrey movie with my life.

What do I hope to accomplish? Not much really, certainly nothing heroic or praiseworthy. What happens here is also not up to me. I just want to welcome everyday opportunities to know, love, and serve others, as Christ leads. I would love for others to try this with me. Perhaps your church might want to enter into this season together with a new openness to God's sovereignty, to his loving leadership, and to your neighbors. Imagine the possibilities. As, in Christ, God has offered us his "Divine Yes," let us also offer ours to others.

Let your "Yes" be "Yes,"
