District NMI President Goes Home To Be With The Lord

William "Bill" Ralph Brandon III, 62, of Troy, IL, was called Home to Eternal Glory at 10:40 p.m. Mon. July 22, 2013 at Relais Bonne Eau Hospice Home in Edwardsville, IL after a valiant 15 month battle with cancer.

He was born Sept. 16, 1950 in Carbondale, IL to the late William Ralph & Doris Marie (Stanley) Brandon

On Jan. 19, 1973, he and Deborah Lynn Lewis were married in Murphysboro, IL. She survives in Troy.

Bill led a life of service unto others. He was a U.S. Army veteran serving with the Military Police as a dog handler from 1970 to 1972. Upon his return home, he began a career as a police officer, with Murphysboro P.D. from 1972 to 1977, Carbondale P.D. from 1977 to 1987, IL State Police from 1987 to 2002 and Washington University P.D. from 2002 to 2005. He then worked as an Investigator for Metro Investigation from 2005 to 2006. In 2006 he joined the Madison Co. Coroner's office where he worked as a Deputy Investigator until illness forced his retirement. He was a Past President and member of the State of IL Division of International Assoc. for Identification and was an Internationally certified Senior Crime Scene Analyst as well as being a certified Diplomat with the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators. He was a Lay Pastor of Highland Church of the Nazarene and member of Belleville First Church of the Nazarene. He actively served the Lord in the Nazarene Church, especially in mission work as IL District Nazarene Missions International President, where he participated in mission work around the world, including such locations as: Jordan, Israel, Guatemala, Mexico, Brazil, Sri Lanka, India, Kenya and Ethiopia. He loved his Lord, his family and his friends.

In addition to his wife of 40 years, he is survived by: 2 sons and daughters-in-law, Robert William & Susan Elizabeth Brandon of O'Fallon, IL and Timothy Lewis & Teresa Amy Brandon of Pittsburg, IL, a daughter and son-in-law, Amanda Lynn & Brady Smith of Troy, IL,, 5 beloved grandchildren, Caleb Robert Brandon, Avery Elizabeth Brandon, Mackenzie Lynn Brandon, Audrey Marie Brandon and Jovey Lynn Smith, a brother and sister-in-law, Scott & Joyce Brandon of Murphysboro, 3 sisters and 2 brothers-in-law, Nancy & Lonnie West of Dongola, IL, Susan & Wayne Chamberlaign of Carbondale and Beth Brandon also of Carbondale, a brother-in-law, Warren Owens of Virden, IL, many nieces and nephews and dear friends and CSI partner, Al & Linda Busch of Fairview Heights, IL.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Karen Owens.
